Subject: Sports Cool Drink Water Station / Water Bottle Refill

Dear Mr. Steele,

Last year I joined the Halifax Beautification Committee. When I joined, I expressed an interest in trying to educate Halifax residents regarding plastic waste, particularly single use water bottles. Colby Silva joined the committee at the same time. Ms Silva had noticed that the water bubbler at the ballfield/playground had been removed. She hoped that the HBC could attempt to try to raise funds for a new water bubbler/water bottle refill station thereby reducing the amount of single use water bottles utilized. The water fountain/water bottle refill stations look fantastic but cost thousands of dollars.

A couple of weeks ago, I talked with Joe Leaver, executive vice president of Old Colony YMCA in East Bridgewater. The YMCA has 3 indoor water bottle refill/bubbler stations. I asked him if there was one outside. He said, "Oh no, they are far too expensive." He said the YMCA provides all campers with reusable water bottles and that the YMCA had purchased Drinking Stations. Drinking stations come with filters and can easily be brought in for the winter or moved around as needed. The cost of one of these is well under \$600.

Do you know why the water bubbler was removed?

What do the sports camps and sports teams in Halifax use for hydration right now?

Is there access to water at the HES ball field, the field next to the police station, the Summit Street ball field and to HOPS for drinking stations to be hooked into or for a water bubbler/ bottle refill stations to be installed?

Do you think it is reasonable that a drinking station could be left out 24/7 in the spring/summer/fall at the either the HES ballfield or at HOPS for the general public to use?

Below are links to the two different concepts. At this point these are mere ideas and do not necessarily represent an exact model of what the committee would want to try to pursue. I am just trying to gather information.
