SHINE Counselors can help you understand your plan changes, as well as other options you may have. Call early to get a SHINE appointment during Open Enrollment! Do Not Wait Until It's Too Late! Our trained SHINE volunteer, Maria Burke, offers free, confidential counseling on all aspects of Medicare and Medicare-related health insurance programs.


