Are you living with pre-Diabetes or a diagnosis of diabetes?

We are offering a 5 week series on Wednesdays, starting October 19th until November 16th from 1:30 to 3:30pm. The classes will cover:

- •Nutrition Management: How do I control food intake to keep blood sugars in range?
- •Monitoring blood sugars: What's considered a high or low number, what do those numbers mean and how do I manage them?
- •Exercise: Realizing and accepting that exercise is best, how much should I do, and when is the best time to exercise?
- •Medications: Oral or injectable...what is your type?
- •Complications: What do I need to stay on my safe journey to prevent long-term complications associated with diabetes?
