- Tax bills, rent receipt or land rent
- Social Security cards for ALL in household
- Photo ID
- Copy of your homeowners insurance policy



VA Doctor?

MUCH PROPERTY You MAY qualify for a tax credit from the state if you pay rent or property taxes.....Do we have your attention yet!? This information is for you if are 65 or over whose property taxes for 25% of rent exceed 10% of your annual income and who meet other qualifying

criteria. You may be eligible even if you receive a property tax exemption through the town of Halifax!

The look-back year goes to 2012 if you investigate before April 15, 2015. Call the Mass. Department of Revenue for more information at 617-887-6367 or online at https:// wfb.dor.state.ma.us/webfile/wsi
