Elder abuse is anv form mistreatment that results in harm or loss to an older person, according to the National Committee for the Prevention of Elder Abuse. The abuse



could take the form of domestic violence, financial exploitation, neglect, physical harm, psychological abuse or sexual abuse. Because each type of abuse is so different, the indicators associated with them often vary, but it is important to reach out and make a phone call to the Elder Abuse Hotline. Calls go directly to the Massachusetts-based call center at 1-800-922-2275 regardless of the location of the reporter or the elder.


Month of May: SENIOR ART SHOW at the Holmes Library

CLEVER IDEAS WORTH KNOWING

ALL residents of our town need to re-check their **monthly electric bill** to be certain that they are not charged from a "supplier" of service that is NOT town approved. You may be **paying more** than necessary or even permitted. In addition, there are some residents at the Halifax Park who have basic cable service included in their rent. If you see fees being charged for cable (T.V) only you may be **overcharged** and need to **review** your bills!

South Shore Community Action Council (SSCAC) Inc., runs a fuel assistance program. Call 508-746-6707 (or toll free 877-FUEL-AID) to speak with a live operator from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. There is also a 24-hour voice-response system that enables applicants and clients to learn how the program works, access the status of their application and hear a list of payments made. In addition, the Halifax COA (elderly only), 781-293-7313 accepts applications on behalf of SSCAC. And, you can visit the SSCAC website for a complete listing of volunteer sites and their contact information and hours for fuel assistance applications.
