These appointments are available on TUESDAY & WEDNESDAY from 1:00-3:00pm. Being pro-active in applying will alleviate the time required to file successfully. Documents needed to begin the process are:

- Recent electric, telephone and fuel bills
- ♦ Copies of: 4 recent pay stubs, award letter or pension statements for social security, veterans benefits, workers compensation or unemployment benefits, tax bill, rent or land receipt, Social Security cards for each person in household
- Photo ID (such as License).
- Front page of home owners insurance policy.



A typical grocery bag weighs about 15 pounds and contains roughly \$40 worth of food items such as: milk, cheese, ground

turkey, yogurt, spinach, carrots, dried fruit, spaghetti, peanut butter and cereal. Distribution is on the 3rd Wednesday. Check our calendar enclosed to be certain of times and dates, but you must connect with our Outreach Workers first.

The 2020 Census is coming to Halifax! This might be an important and unique way for you to support our community. The Census data determines Federal funding to Medicare and Medicaid, MassHealth, Children's Health Insurance Program, and several Health Center programs. The Census also determines our political representation for the next 10 years at a local, state and federal levels. In addition to taking the time to collect the information they need, they are hiring Census takers, and offer \$21.00/hr. and 58c per mile for travel. Much of the work can be done from home by phone, not all contacts are done door to door.
