HISTORICAL TIDBIT: HOLMES LIBRARY BEGINNINGS

In 1876, Doctor Howland Holmes of Lexington, MA donated the sum of one hundred dollars to establish a free library in the town of Halifax.

Dr. Holmes was the oldest brother of a resident of Halifax, John Holmes, who is best remembered for his work as a tin peddler.

The old Town Hall, which had been the original meeting-house, housed the library in a room once used as a drill hall. The building was destroyed in a fire in 1907 and the contents were a total loss.
