
Summer Reads

Virtual Catalog to Become Commonwealth Catalog

For over 10 years the Virtual Catalog has been the place to request library materials in Massachusetts libraries outside of the SAILS Network, but it's time for a new system. The Virtual Catalog is getting an overhaul and a new name — the Commonwealth Catalog.

Eventually all networks will switch over from the Virtual Catalog to the new Commonwealth Catalog.

The SAILS Network is in the first group of libraries to switch, but starting **July 1**, the

Virtual Catalog will not be available to SAILS members. In **August**, the Commonwealth Catalog will open up for staff to make requests and in **September** for all library patrons to make requests.

We will still be able to place inter-library loan requests for you at any point during this process. Please ask for what you would like to request.

More exact dates should be available soon, but in the meantime, please bear with us during this transition!
