

Book Museum Passes Online

Through the support of the Friends of the Library and the Halifax Cultural Council, the library has several passes/ coupons that provide discounted or free admission to area museums. Starting March 1, you may reserve a museum pass online with a valid SAILS library card.

Visit our Web site and click on "Museum Passes" at the bottom of the page or under the Information tab. Search by the date you're interested in (using the calendar) or by the pass that you're interested in.

Click or tap "Request Pass" for

the date and the pass that you're interested in, and enter your library card barcode number. Click on "Continue" and if you would like, you may enter an email address and request an email reminder of your reservation. Verify the information is correct, and click "Submit This Request" as the final step.

When the library is open, you may still make a reservation in person or by phone. Passes must still be picked up in person with your valid SAILS library card no more than 24 hours in advance or on the previous working day.
