# ARTICLE I Filling of Land [Adopted 3-14-1981]

# § 208-1. Filling of submergible lands.

The filling of land which is ordinarily submerged during any portion of the year, in order to provide for sufficient area to make it suitable for building purposes, is not considered as an acceptable practice, and such lands are considered as not suitable from a sanitary point of view for human habitation.

### § 208-2. Filling to provide maximum groundwater elevation.

The filling of land in order to provide the four-foot minimum distance between the bottom of the disposal field and the maximum groundwater elevation is not considered as an acceptable practice, and such lands are considered as not suitable from a sanitary point of view for human habitation.
