During the upcoming AUTUMN-like days, , it's time to rethink what amount of oil is in your oil tank! If you applied for **fuel assistance** last year you will possibly be receiving another application in the mail from South Shore Community Action Council. Review the forms, make necessary changes, give all the documentation they require, sign, date it and return to them. This is called the 'recertification' process. Please give Joyce or Elaine a call if you need help, but it's so much easier if you are prepared rather than caught off-guard.

LOWER your chances of getting or spreading the flu:

- •Get both a seasonal flu shot and H1N1 flu shot.
- •Cover your mouth when you cough or sneeze. Use a tissue or your inner elbow, NOT YOUR HANDS.
- •Wash your hands often with soap and water, or use an alcohol-based hand gel.
- •Stay home if you are sick!

The flu spreads easily from person to person and should be taken seriously.

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
