

QUALIFIED RESIDENTS OF HALIFAX may receive an abatement on their property By meeting income and asset requirements, each person who works in a community service with town departments (Assessor's, Council on Aging, Library or Recycling) may get \$750 off their taxes if they finish the total hours required. COMING SOON....NEW MEDICARE CARDS! Within the next year, new Medicare cards will be sent to everyone on Medicare with social security numbers being removed to help protect your identity. You will have a new, unique Medicare number



Security Number is not changing and will be used for other purposes as before. BEWARE of anyone who contacts you about the new cards. HOME DELIVERED OR COMMUNITY DINE-IN MEALS?

You can receive meals delivered to your home through OCES.

DID YOU KNOW THAT YOU may qualify for cash or credit from the Commonwealth if you pay rent or property taxes? The "Circuit Breaker" Tax program is for persons 65 or over whose property taxes (or 25% of rent) exceed 10% of their annual income and who meet other criteria.
