Due to new federal and state requirements, you need to provide more documents than you have before in order to get or RENEW a driver's license, ID card or learner's permit. In addition, aller October 2020, you will need either a passport or 'REAL ID' when you fly in the U.S or all empt to enter certain federal buildings.
