Planning the Library's Future


Planning Time

Learn a Language with Mango!

We are now offering the Mango Languages online language-learning system free to all Holmes Library patrons! Mango can be accessed anywhere with an Internet connection. Try a first lesson in any language before being prompted for your library card number or create a profile right away.

Mango can be accessed at the library, remotely, or on the go with apps for iPhone, Android, Kindle and Nook. Mango offers access to 60 foreign language courses and 17 English courses.

Mango also offers the opportunity to learn through foreign film with Mango Premiere and access mini courses, like Pirate and Medical Spanish.

Each lesson combines reallife situations and audio from native speakers with simple, clear instructions. Courses are presented with an appreciation for real-world application by focusing on the four key elements of language learning: vocabulary, pronunciation, grammar, and culture.

Mango Languages takes the place of Universal Class, which we are no longer offering.
