I personally was so impressed by a foster care parent and her child who came to share their story for our "What can I do?" program. There were 16 programs with total attendance of 133. Checkouts were high, feedback was plentiful, programs were good quality, but I was disappointed in the turnout for many of the programs. A Kindness tree handmade and beautifully created by Assistant Director Marie Coady was on display on the book table. Looking like leaves different ways to show kindness were displayed on the tree. Inspirational bookmarks were purchased and place on the table. Pictures and artifacts from the Library's Puppet Troupe Company H, Friends of the Library, the Beautification Committee, The Boy Scouts and Girls Scouts were displayed in the Library Display case. 31 young patrons completed the Kindness Savage Hunt and receive a Dr. Seuss eraser. Young Adult patrons created no-sew fleece blankets for pet shelters and also created "positive sticky notes"- sticky notes with inspirational quotes and illustrations during Teen Craft night. Working with the Silver Lake Middle School Librarian Vicki Wright, Children's Librarian Stacey Beshers brought the sticky notes to the Peer Leadership group where 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders discussed how they would like to expand upon the project and discussing ways they could spread them throughout the school to spread cheer and kindness.

Paintings from the Council of Aging painting class are on display in the community room for the Month of May. This is a popular event each year. The Library with host a COA Art Show reception on May 23<sup>rd</sup> at 1:00 PM. Light refreshments will be served. Janice Campbell from the Halifax Congregational Church has shared her origami crane display. Each crane has a prayer written on the inside. The cranes are hung along the circulation desk. Public comment has been very positive. Thank You to Janice and the Seniors from the painting class for sharing their creative work with our community.
